Paul Yoder is one of the best known and best loved composer-arrangers in America today. Music directors everywhere recognize and appreciate the quality and content of his compositions. There would be very few school and professional bands in the country that did not include Yoder compositions and arrangements.

He is a product of the school band movement in the United States. Paul Yoder attended high school in Grand Forks, North Dakota, and played in the high school band under the direction of Mr. Leo Haesle. Through Mr. Haesle's recommendation he secured a job in one of the local theaters playing for silent pictures and vaudeville. With the advent of talking pictures he started playing in a local dance band in which he played until he graduated from the University of North Dakota in 1930. While at the University he was the assistant to Prof. John E. Howard for three years. He later received an honorary Doctor of Music degree from his Alma Mater in 1953. He completed a Master of Music degree at Northwestern in 1941.

Mr. Yoder is the immediate past President of the American Bandmasters' Association. While holding this office, he created the ABA Research Center for Bands located at the University of Maryland. Through this project an effort will be made to collect all pertinent information on the history and tradition of the BAND in the United States and Canada. To assist in this work chairmen have been appointed in each state to research this information. Mr. Ardeen Foss and Mr. Russ Henegar are working on this project to develop the South Dakota Story. The cooperation of all band directors will be greatly appreciated.

Some of Mr. Yoder's best known original compositions for concert band include: Relax, Flumenco, La Fonda, Swing Bolero, Arkansamba, Hurricane's, Bobby's Blues, Anacapri, Carolina Clambake, Rush Street Tarantella. He has written or arranged more than 1,200 numbers that have been published in the past 32 years.

Mr. Yoder is a member of ASCAP, ABA, AF of M, Phi Mu Alpha, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Mu, Phi Beta Mu, and many other musical organizations. At present he makes his home in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

The South Dakota Bandmasters Association would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr. Paul Yoder for giving the students and directors the privilege of working with him these past two days. It has been inspirational and gratifying to have had the opportunity to play under the direction of such a famous composer.
