## GUEST CONDUCTOR

### DR. HARRY BEGIAN

Director of Bands  
University of Illinois  
Urbana Campus



Harry Begian was named Director of Bands at the University of Illinois, Urbana Campus, in 1970. Immediately prior to this appointment he was Director of Bands at Michigan State University for three years. Before his work at Michigan State he had been Director of Bands at Wayne State University, also for three years. Begian's work at both of these universities carried forward the reputation he earned during his many years at Detroit's Cass Technical High School where he developed one of the finest high school bands in the country. During his last few years at Cass, Begian headed the Music and Performing Arts Departments.

Begian's musical training was in the public schools of Michigan where he was a private student of Leonard Smith, the well-known cornet and trumpet virtuoso. He received bachelor's and master's degrees from Wayne State University in Detroit, and later earned his doctorate at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.

Begian organized and conducted his first band and orchestra while in his late teens and has studied conducting at Tanglewood, summer home of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. He has appeared as guest conductor, adjudicator, clinician, and lecturer throughout the United States and Canada. Along with a very busy work schedule, he has found time to conduct operatic and Broadway performances, community symphony orchestras, community concert bands, and a church choir.

A charter member of the American School Band Directors Association, he is also a member of the American Bandmasters Association, the College Band Directors National Association, Omicron Delta Kappa, an honorary member of Phi Beta Mu and the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association. His professional affiliations include memberships in Phi Mu Alpha, Phi Delta Kappa, the American Musicological Society, and the Society for Ethnomusicology.

He is a recipient of the National Band Association CITATION OF EXCELLENCE and the ASBDA EDWIN FRANKO GOLDMAN AWARD.

Students are selected for All-State Band by a competitive audition held in ten cities. This year 1286 students registered to be auditioned for positions in the All-State Band. It is likely that there will be some with the same audition score as those who are in the Band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

1. Former members.
2. Former alternates.
3. A student whose school is not represented is given first preference.
4. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
5. If none of the above criteria applies, the audition judges break the tie.
