ARNALD D. GABRIEL**

**Commander-Conductor
the United States Air Force Band
Washington, D.C.**



Colonel Arnald D. Gabriel, dynamic young conductor of The United States Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra, and The Singing Sergeants in Washington, D. C., has been acclaimed by musicians and critics throughout the world as one of our nation's outstanding conductors.

Colonel Gabriel is one of the world's most widely-traveled directors, having conducted in all 50 of the United States and in 45 countries throughout the world.

On October 1, 1970, when he was promoted to the rank of Colonel, he became the youngest musician in the military service to attain that grade.

Since assuming his present position as Commander and Conductor of the premiere musical organization of the U. S. Air Force in 1964, Colonel Gabriel has instituted a new tour concept for The U. S. Air Force Band and Singing Sergeants which presents concerts as a public service without admission charge. Tours under his concept have been overwhelming successes.

Colonel Gabriel first entered the armed forces from his hometown, Cortland, New York, in 1943. Discharged in 1946, he entered Ithaca College, New York, as a music major. Graduating Cum Laude in 1950, his biography appeared in "Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities" that year.

Colonel Gabriel re-entered the service in 1951 as a Warrant Officer-Bandleader. He was first assigned to Sampson AFB, Geneva, New York. In 1953 he commuted to Ithaca College and earned his Masters Degree in Music Education.

Colonel Gabriel was appointed Command Band Director, United States Air Forces in Europe, and Commander and Conductor of the USAF Europe Band, Wiesbaden, Germany, in 1958. It was during this unprecedented five-year tour of duty that he was awarded the Legion of Merit for his outstanding service to the United States through music.

In June, 1964, he assumed his present assignment as Commander and Conductor of The United States Air Force Band in Washington, D. C. Under Colonel Gabriel's command, The U. S. Air Force Band has twice been awarded the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award.

In April, 1974, Colonel Gabriel received the St. Cecilia Award, presented annually by the Band of Notre Dame University to the year's outstanding contributor to the Catholic band movement. In June, 1974, Colonel Gabriel was the recipient of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia's rarely-presented National Citation for his "significant contribution to music in America," and in December, 1977, Kappa Kappa Psi, National Band Fraternity, honored him with its Distinguished Service to Music Award.

Colonel Gabriel has guest conducted the Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Glendale, San Antonio, Memphis, Florida and York (Pennsylvania) Symphony Orchestras.

He has also guest conducted Italy's Carabinieri Band, The Royal Hellenic Band (Athens), The Staff Music Corps (Bonn), The Italian Air Force Band, The National Band of the Canadian Forces (Ottawa) and the Gamagori Band (Japan).

Colonel Gabriel is a member of the advisory board of The School Musician, Director and Teacher magazine, a member of the National Band Association and the National Association for American Composers and Conductors, as well as holding membership in Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi and Psi Beta Mu National Music Fraternities. Additionally, he holds life membership in the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

In March, 1978, he was elected Vice-President of the American Bandmasters Association, in 1979 he assumed the position of President-Elect, and in March, 1980 at the annual convention of the ABA, he became President of this prestigious association.

ALTERNATES FOR SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

Students are selected for All-State Band by a competitive audition held in ten cities. This year 1,223 students registered to be auditioned for positions in the All-State Band. It is likely that there will be some with the same audition score as those who are in the Band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

1. Former members.
2. Former alternates.
3. A student whose school is not represented is given first preference.
4. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
5. If none of the above criteria applies, the audition judges break the tie.
