## ALL-STATE BAND BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The members of the All-State Band were selected by auditioning at one of the eight audition centers throughout the State. The four audition judges fly around the State to each site over a period of five days and listen to students. From that number the 169 students that are in this year's band were selected. The members of the Band represent 51 South Dakota schools. There are 68 seniors, 43 juniors, 42 sophomores and 16 freshmen in the band.

## GUEST CONDUCTOR



**Weston Noble**

Decorah, Iowa

Weston Noble, who in 1989 was named the Outstanding Music Educator of the United States by the National Federation of High School Associations, is Director of Music Activities at Luther College, Decorah, Iowa. An internationally known conductor and clinician, he is the first recipient of this national citation.

Mr. Noble has served as guest director for music festivals in forty-seven states, Canada and Europe. More than 50 all-state choruses, bands, and orchestras have been under his direction, with a total of over 725 festivals. It is believed he is the only conductor asked to conduct all-state groups in all three of the media - bands, choirs and orchestras.

The Luther Nordic Choir appeared on the National Convention program of the American Choral Directors Association held in Salt Lake City, Utah, at the Mormon Tabernacle in 1985, receiving a standing ovation at this time. Nordic shared the program of the final evening with the Mormon Tabernacle Choir. Luther groups have also performed in Chicago, New York, Washington, D.C., Los Angeles, Minneapolis and St. Paul.

Mr. Noble has conducted Luther groups for seven concert tours in Europe which have included countries from Norway to Rumania and the USSR. While in the USSR the other groups have performed at Rachmaninoff Hall, Moscow and the Leningrad Conservatory of Music, Leningrad.

A charter member of the American Choral Directors Association and an elected member of the American Bandmasters Association, Mr. Noble is listed in "World Biographical Hall of Fame", "Dictionary of International Biography", "1970 Creative and Successful Personalities of the World", "Who's Who in Music", "The World's Who's Who of Musicians", "Who's Who in American Education", and "Dictionary of Distinguished Americans". In October 1971, he was awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Arts by Augustana College, Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

In July of 1973 and 1974, Mr. Noble adjudicated at the International Festival of Three Cities (Vienna, Budapest and Prague), participating groups coming from the United States, Europe and Asia. In July of 1980, he conducted the choir for America's Youth Concert in a tour of Europe from Rome to London, with an appearance in Carnegie Hall, New York City. At present he is on the board of International Concerts, Inc., an organization involved in bringing together 10,000 choral musicians from the United States and 10,000 Soviet Union Choral musicians to perform as a festival choir in Tallin, Estonia, in 1991.

In February, 1992, the Illinois Music Educators Association presented Mr. Noble with their "Presidential Award" which is "given to an individual, without restriction as to state or country, who is deserving of VERY SPECIAL recognition for outstanding service to music and music education." In October, 1992, he will be presented the "Distinguished Merit Award" by the University of Michigan School of Music. The Iowa Music Educators Association will present Mr. Noble with their "Outstanding Music Educator Award" in November, 1992.

## SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME

**DOUG CARPENTER:** Taught at Alexandria while in college, 1950-53 Geddes, 1953-60 Tripp, 1960-87 Watertown, 1961 and currently director of the Watertown Municipal Band. 1958 Outstanding Bandmaster Award-Kappa Kappa Si, 1975 Teacher of the Year, 1976 Bandmaster of the Year Award-Phi Beta Mu, 1982 MAC, 1985 NBA Citation of Excellence, 1987 elected to membership of American Bandmasters Association, Past V.P. and President of SDBA, Sec./Treas. of SDBA since 1969. While under his direction the Watertown HS band received all Superior ratings at the large group contests. He is in high demand as a clinician and adjudicator at numerous music festivals and contests.

**CARL "CHRISTY" CHRISTENSEN:** Carl "Christy" Christensen was a fine musician and the perfect gentleman. He was truly Mr. Bandman at SDSC for nearly half a century and undoubtedly favorably influenced literally hundreds of students who had the good fortune to play for him. 1911-53 directed bands at South Dakota State College (University), 1918 Named Professor of Music and Head of Music Dept. SDSC (now SDSU), 1929 received Honorary BM Degree from McPhail College of Music, 1932 First SD member elected to American Bandmasters Association, 1939 SD Military Band paraded before the King and Queen of England (Winnipeg, Canada), 1961 "Christy" Ballroom in Pugsley Union Building dedicated to him.

**RAY T. DEVILBISS:** Taught 1941-42 in Missouri, 1946-53 in Iowa, 1953-81 Director of Bands and Professor of Music at USD, 1953-81 Director of Annual USD Instrumental Clinic, 1958-82 first cornet All-American Bandmaster Band at Midwest National Band Clinic in Chicago, 1962 Established Jazz Unlimited program at USD, 1967-82 Sec./Treas. of the CBDNA - North Central Division, 1967-82 Cornet soloist with Golden Age Band, 1969 elected to the American Bandmasters Association, 1974 Outstanding Conductor the Year Award-School Music Magazine, 1976 Established Band Directors Summer Mini-Workshop, 1977 MNA Citation of Excellence, 1979 Meritorious Service Award-North Central Athletic Conference, 1981 SD Outstanding Bandmasters Award, 1981 Distinguished Service Award-SD Chapter of Phi Beta Mu, 1983 Distinguished Service Award-SDMEA, 1984 National Outstanding Contributor to Bands Award-Phi Beta Mu, 1991 Professional Service Award, 1956-82 26 years SD All-State Band Audition Judge, 1961 Charter President of the SD Chapter of Phi Beta Mu.

**WILLIAM "BILL" IRELAND:** Taught at Flandreau 1924-48, Madison 1948-69. Was a member of SDBA, American School Band Directors Assoc. He was on the National Advisory Board of LeBlanc Music Educators. 1955 received Outstanding HS Band Director of SD, received the first annual Outstanding Bandmasters Award-Phi Beta Mu, proclaimed "Ambassador of Music" by the Ambassador Club of the Chamber of Commerce, Scholarship named in his honor by the band parents organization, judge for the marching contest at Arizona State University. His bands in Madison and Flandreau were considered the bands to try to beat at music contests.

**HARVEY MOEN:** Taught 1932-34 Augustana Academy in Canton, 1934-35 in Groton. In 1935 Mr. Moen joined the International Marimba Symphony Orchestra on a concert tour of Europe. The orchestra of 100 marimbas presented a concert in Carnegie Hall when they returned to the U.S. In the fall of 1935 Mr. Moen became the director of the Canton High School band which won top honors in state music contests and placed second in the last national music contest in Cleveland, OH in 1936. The band also received a first rating in the national regional contest in Omaha in 1936. In 1939 he received his Masters Degree from the University of Michigan. He returned for another year at Canton then accepted a teaching position at Northern State Teachers College (now NSU) from 1940-74 and then half time till 1978. All-State Band judge for 35 years, 7 years as All-State Orchestra judge, 1981-SDMEA Award - Devotion to Music Education, 1976 SDBMA honored him for 25 years as All-State Band Judge, 1982 Theta Nu Chapter of Sinfonia Award-Man of Music, 1974-Northern State College (NSU) - inscribed gong, 1986-SDHSAA-Distinguished Service Award. He is a member of Phi Beta Mu, Pi Kappa Lambda (National Music Honor Society), SDMEA. He has served as an adjudicator and clinician at numerous contests and festivals.

**GLENN SIVERSON:** Taught 1961-65 at Philip, 1965-91 at Canton. He received many state and national awards in music including SD Outstanding Band Master (MAC) Award, Outstanding Band Director and recently named Outstanding Band Educator of South Dakota 1991-92 of the National Federation of Inter-scholastic Music. He was also a member of the Educational Association, MENC, SD Music Educators, SDBA, and Phi Beta Mu. He recently served as SDBA Vice President and President. He served as guest clinician and adjudicator for many music festivals and contests. He was also known to have numerous students in All-State Band and Orchestra each year.
