ALL-STATE BAND BACKGROUND INFORMATION

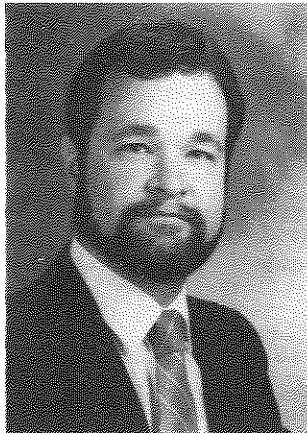
The members of the All-State Band were selected by auditioning at one of the six audition centers throughout the State. The four audition judges fly around the State to each site over a period of six days and listen to students. From that number the 167 students that are in this year's band were selected. The members of the Band represent 50 South Dakota schools. There are 69 seniors, 55 juniors, 30 sophomores and 13 freshmen in the band.

ROBERT SHELDON

Robert Sheldon has taught instrumental music in the Florida and Illinois public schools and has served on faculty at the Florida State University where he taught conducting and music education classes, and directed the university bands. He now maintains an active composition and teaching schedule in Illinois, and regularly accepts commissions for new works. Sheldon received the Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Miami and the Master of Fine Arts degree from the University of Florida.

An internationally recognized clinician, Sheldon has conducted numerous Regional and All-State bands throughout the United States and abroad. He holds membership in several music organizations that promote music and music education. The American School Band Directors Association has honored him with the Volkwein Award for composition and the Stanbury Award for teaching. He has also been a ten-time recipient of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publisher's "Standard Award" for his compositional contributions in the symphonic and concert repertoire. Several of his compositions are featured on a recently released compact disc entitled "*IMAGES: The Music Of Robert Sheldon*". In 1990, he was honored by the International Assembly of Phi Beta Mu as being the International Outstanding Bandmaster of the year.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

During this evening's concert various special presentations will be made. Included in these presentations will be the induction of an individual into the SDBA "Hall of Fame" and the presentation of the NFIMA Award.

SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME

Bryan Parks

Bryan Parks' contribution to the world of music can't be measured by honors awarded, music degrees earned, contributions to music organizations or the number of bands directed, but rather by the number of lives touched with his music, students inspired by his philosophy, and a community blessed with his loyalty and desire to serve there for his lifetime. The music careers of many professional musicians started under Bryan's baton in Platte High School. More importantly, Bryan's students whose lives became enriched by a better understanding and a love of good music are beyond counting.

Bryan never went to college. Jokingly he said, "I graduated from the school of Hard Knocks." He did study under eminent men such as Herbert L. Clarke of the cornet and completed correspondence study under well known musicians. He was issued a permit to teach band in Platte High School in 1925 at the age of 29. The next spring his Platte High School band played in the first state contest in South Dakota. Bryan directed the Platte High School band for 40 years and won 35 consecutive state and regional contests.

When Bryan first started to direct the band there was little to work with - no instruments and no books. A call for old instruments brought battered horns and drums hidden away in attics and damp basements. Bryan's training as a jeweler came in handy. He repaired these instruments and got them in working order.

Before long there was an active Band Booster organization that helped purchase many instruments and as long as Bryan directed, students were supplied instruments to play at no cost. Bryan continued to repair instruments himself. Soon both the horns and the music library were topnotch.

The band was the pride of the community. From humble beginnings of 25 members playing beat up instruments, the band grew to 75 pieces with excellent instruments, a wonderful sound, and good quality performance of good quality music.

Band concerts in a band shell on main street in Platte were a Saturday night attraction for years. Former band members returned to play with the band during the summer whenever they could.

Bryan retired from teaching in 1965 after years of gradually failing eye-sight. In 1975 he was Grand Marshall of Platte's Diamond Jubilee. He died the following year - February 9, 1976. To this day Bryan Parks is an esteemed name in the Platte community, and his former students count him as a friend who touched their lives in a lasting way.

NATIONAL FEDERATION INTERSCHOLASTIC MUSIC AWARD

Marlin A. Pedersen, Gregory

Marlin Pedersen has been involved with teaching music since 1959, when he started teaching K-12 vocal and instrumental music at Volga, SD. From 1963-89 he taught 5-12 instrumental music in Gregory, SD. In 1982-83, he directed the Gregory High School choral music program along with the instrumental program. From 1989-94, he taught 6-8 instrumental music and assisted in supervising the high school solo and ensemble contest students and the All-State Band auditionees in Winner, SD.

Since 1994, Pedersen has provided private instrumental lessons and served as a music consultant for various area schools. He has served as an instructor at the Rushmore Music Camp in the Black Hills since 1972.

Pedersen is a member of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (member of the Board and State ADBA President), South Dakota Music Educators (band representative on the State Board), Phi Beta Mu (board member and as State President), National Band Association, American School Band Directors Association, and the SDHSAA Music Advisory Committee. He has been an adjudicator for both high school and middle school contests throughout South Dakota and parts of Nebraska as well as a clinic-festival conductor in several South Dakota and Nebraska communities.

Although his marching band and jazz band won numerous awards, Pedersen's main emphasis was always the concert band. It was always his belief that good bands were built by participation in solos and ensembles. While teaching at Gregory, the grade 9-12 school enrollment fluctuated around 150 students. Pedersen maintained a band enrollment of over 100 students.

Milo Winter former band director at Rapid City Stevens, said: "Perhaps Mr. Pedersen's most highly regarded contribution to music education is his total unselfishness in giving of his time and talents to others including both teachers and students."
