ALL-STATE BAND BACKGROUND INFORMATION

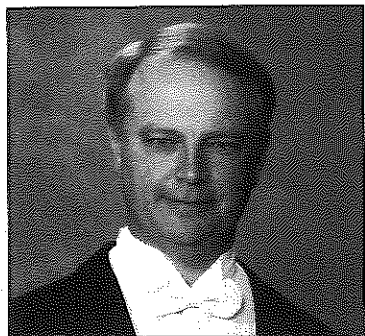

The four audition judges fly around the State to each site over a period of six days and listen to students. From that number the 164 students that are in this year's band were selected. GUEST CONDUCTOR



DR. JOHN R. LOCKE

University of North Carolina, Greensboro

Since 1982, Dr. John R. Locke has served on the UNCG School of Music Faculty as Director of Bands, Professor of Music and Conductor of the University Wind Ensemble. He holds the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from West Virginia University and the Doctor of Education degree from the University of Illinois. Previously, Dr. Locke held teaching positions in music at West Virginia University, Southeast Missouri State University, and the University of Illinois. Dr. Locke has conducted band performances throughout the country including the National Conventions of the MENC, ABA, CBDNA, the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC and Lincoln Center in New York City. In addition, he has guest conducted the U.S. Air Force Band, U.S. Army Field Band, U.S. Navy Band and the Dallas Wind Symphony, as well as numerous university bands. He has published articles on band literature in *The Journal of Band Research* and *Winds Quarterly* and is the former Editor of *The North Carolina Music Educator*. In 1989, Dr. Locke was selected for membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association. He has received the Phi Mu Alpha *Orpheus Award* and has been a recipient of the National Band Association *Citation of Excellence* on three occasions. He is a National Arts Associate of Sigma Alpha Iota. In 1994, Dr. Locke received the Phi Beta Mu International Fraternity *Outstanding Bandmaster of the Year Award*, presented at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago. He is Past-President of the North Carolina Music Educators Association, an affiliate of MENC. In 1999, Dr. Locke became President of the Southern Division of the College Band Directors National Association and a member of the Board of Directors of the American Bandmasters Association. In 2002, Dr. Locke was nominated for the *O. Max Gardner Award*, the highest award in the 16-campus UNC System. Dr. Locke was awarded the *Outstanding Teacher Award* in the School of Music in April 2003. In 2004, he was elected President-Elect of the American Bandmasters Association. Dr. Locke maintains an active schedule of guest conducting and adjudicating bands throughout the United States and Canada. Dr. Locke is the founding director of the UNCG Summer Music Camp, the largest and most popular music camp in America enrolling 1,730 students annually. Since 1977, he has administered summer music camps for more than 43,000 students.

Dennis Carlson, Chamberlain



From high school valedictorian to graduating magna cum laude from college, Dennis Carlson has always been at the top of his class and has taught his students the same work ethic and passion that he possesses for music. Carlson serves as Chamberlain High School instrumental instructor. He also assists the Chamberlain Middle School band and is a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church choir.

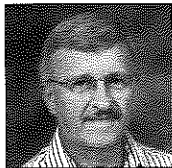
After graduating as highest-ranking senior from Black Hills State University in 1976, Carlson returned to his high school alma mater to enrich the lives of young people through music. In 1980, he received his master's degree in music education from University of South Dakota.

Carlson served on the South Dakota Bandmasters Association Board from 1990 to 1994. In 2000-01, he was president of the South Dakota chapter of Phi Beta Mu, the international band director's fraternity. In 2001, Carlson was the recipient of the South Dakota Outstanding Bandmaster Award.

Under Carlson's direction, his bands have been selected four times to present at the South Dakota Music In-Service State Conference. Prior to this year, 128 of his students have been selected for the All-State Band and the All-State Orchestra. His instrumental groups have won numerous parade and marching competition superiors, first place and Sweepstakes awards. Students under his direction have received consistently high ratings at large group and solo/ensemble contests.

SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME

James Glanzer, Madison



James Glanzer spent 33 years as a music educator. During his music education career he taught in the following school districts:

- 1966-1967-Hanson County Schools
- 1967-1970-Bridgewater Schools
- 1970--1971-Akron (Colorado) Schools
- 1971-1977-Bridgewater Schools
- 1977-1999-Lake Central School District (Madison)

Mr. Glanzer grew up in Bridgewater South Dakota in a family where music was part of their life. He began playing trumpet in elementary school and was encouraged by his Band director as a junior in High School to be a band director. He continued his education at Dakota Wesleyan University where he received a BME degree. Later he attended the University of Northern Colorado where he received a Master of Arts Degree.

When asked about high points in his career, Mr Glanzer said that "Taking the Madison Middle School Band and the Madison 8th Grade Bands to the South Dakota Bandmaster conventions were great moments in teaching." He was honored in 1990 as the South Dakota Bandmaster of the year by Phi Beta Mu. The South Dakota Bandmasters are proud to award Mr. Glanzer with induction in the "South Dakota Bandmasters Hall of Fame" as he has truly been a dedicated educator for the children of South Dakota.

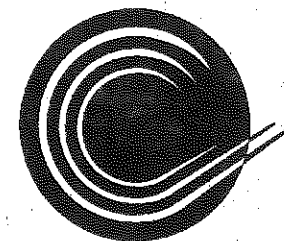
