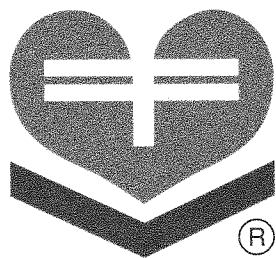

CLARK BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

DR. TIMOTHY MAHR St. Olaf College – Northfield, MN



Timothy Mahr is a professor of music at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, where he is the Conductor of the St. Olaf Band and has taught courses in composition, conducting and music education. Previously, Mahr was Director of Bands at the University of Minnesota, Duluth, for ten years and taught instrumental music at Milaca High School (MN) for three years. Mahr is the principal conductor of the Minnesota Symphonic Winds. He was the founder and conductor of the Twin Ports Wind Ensemble in Duluth. He is a past-president of the North Central Division of the College Band Directors National Association (1999-2001), and has served on the Board of Directors of the National Band Association (1996-98).

Active as a guest conductor and clinician in over thirty states, Mahr has also appeared professionally in Norway, Canada, Mexico, Thailand and Singapore. He has conducted over 25 all-state and intercollegiate bands. Under Mahr's baton, the St. Olaf Band traveled to Norway (1996 and 2005), Britain and Ireland (2000), and took a study tour of Mexico (January 2004) and Japan (January 2010). Additionally, the St. Olaf Band performed at the 1997 American Bandmasters Association Convention, gave its New York City debut at Lincoln Center in 2003 and performed in Minneapolis at the 2004 National Convention of the Music Educators National Conference.

A well-known composer, Mahr has written over 50 works, many of which are published for band. He received the 1991 ABA/Ostwald Award for his piece, *The Soaring Hawk*. Five other works have been finalists in national composition contests. His works have been programmed at Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall in New York, numerous national and international music conferences and in twenty countries. He has been the subject of interview articles in *The Instrumentalist* (March, 1995) and *BDGuide* (March/April, 1993) and has authored articles for major music journals. He is a contributor to the text, *Composers on Composing for Band* (2002).

Mahr was the first recipient of a commission from the American Bandmasters Association Commissioning Project, and the United States Interservice Band premiered the resultant work, *Endurance*, in Washington, DC. He has received over 40 commissions including works for the U.S. Air Force Band, the Music Educators National Conference, and a work celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the American School Band Directors Association. He is a recipient of the National Band Association's "Citation of Excellence" and was elected in 1993 to membership in the American Bandmasters Association.

Mahr graduated *summa cum laude* from St. Olaf College in 1977 and 1978 (B.M. Theory/Composition and B.A. Music Education). In 1983 he received the Master of Arts degree in Trombone Performance from The University of Iowa, where in 1995 he earned a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Instrumental Conducting.

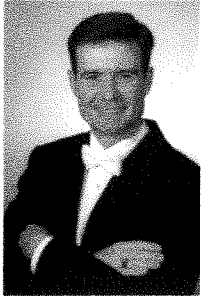

LEWIS BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

SCOTT A. JONES Concordia College – Moorhead, MN



Scott A. Jones is Assistant Professor of Music and Director of Bands at Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota. In addition to conducting The Concordia Band, his teaching responsibilities include courses in Instrumental Conducting and Instrumental Music Education. Prior to his appointment at Concordia College in 2005, Dr. Jones garnered 15 years of teaching experience in the public schools of Apple Valley, Minnesota and Ashville, Ohio.

An ardent supporter of the “composers of today,” Dr. Jones has commissioned more than 20 new compositions for wind band and chamber winds in the past decade. Commissioned composers include David Gilligham, Augusta Read Thomas, Libby Larsen, Clark McAllister, Michael Weinstein, Adam Gorb, Daniel Kallman, Scott McAllister, Timothy Mahr, Rolf Rudin, Lowell Liebermann, Elliott Schwartz, and Shelley Hanson.

A firm believer in creating opportunities for students to interact with great artists of our time, musicians under Jones’ leadership have collaborated with artists Frederick Fennell, Frank Battisti, Seiji Ozawa, David Gillingham, Augusta Read Thomas, Eddie Daniels, Frank Ticheli, Mark Camphouse, The Empire Brass Quintet and a host of other distinguished musical figures.

A native of Fairfax, Virginia, Dr. Jones received his undergraduate degree in Music Education from The Ohio State University (Columbus, OH), a Master’s Degree in Music Education from the Vander Cook College of Music (Chicago, IL), and a Ph.D. in Music from the University of Minnesota (Minneapolis, MN).

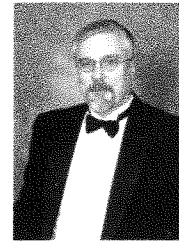
Dr. Jones was named “Music Educator of the Year” by the Minnesota Music Educators Association in 2002, and was one of three school band conductors from the United States selected to participate in the 2004 National Band Association International Conducting Symposium in Rome, Italy. He is creator of the “Wind Band Institute,” a summer workshop for wind band conductors held annually on the campus of Concordia College.

His professional affiliations include MENC: The National Association for Music Education, Minnesota Music Educators Association, Wisconsin Music Educators Association, North Dakota Music Educators Association, South Dakota Music Educators Association, Montana Music Educators Association, World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, Iowa Bandmasters Association, Minnesota Band Directors Association, College Band Directors National Association, National Band Association, Chamber Music America, and Phi Beta Mu.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

NFHS MUSIC ASSOCIATION “OUTSTANDING MUSIC EDUCATION AWARD”

Laurence Johnson - Pierre



Following his graduation from the University of South Dakota in 1973, Johnson taught instrumental music for 35 years in three different school systems. During his career his teaching responsibilities ranged from elementary to high school music and includes 30 years teaching in the Pierre School system. He spent 12 years teaching in the junior high school with the last 18 years being spent teaching at Pierre Riggs High School. He served as a member of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association’s

Board as well as serving a term as the president of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association from 1999 through 2000. He served as a member of the marching band committee for the dedication of the South Dakota WWII, Korean and Vietnam War Memorials.

Johnson earned the South Dakota Music Educators Association Distinguished Career Award in 2008. He served as regional coordinator for the All-State Band Auditions for 18 years and as the site host coordinator for the South Dakota All-State Band on three occasions. He was invited and over the years has directed several regional band festivals including the South Dakota Middle School All-State Band. Governor Mike Rounds proclaimed May 13, 2008, as Larry Johnson Day in South Dakota.

Under his direction, Pierre Riggs High School Bands and Jazz Bands consistently received superior ratings in Large Group Contests. Seventy-five percent of the students who participated in solo and ensemble contests earned superior ratings. A total of 64 of his students have earned positions in All-State Band and two of his Pierre Riggs High School bands were chosen to perform at the State Music Conference in Brookings.

For his retirement from teaching, the music community of Pierre commissioned a band composition in his honor for his years of service to the community. Johnson still maintains an active role in music through his involvement with the Capitol City Band and the Juel Johnson Jazz Festival in Pierre.

BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the All-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the All-State Band and both have been involved with the process since that time. In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the All-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.

Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.
